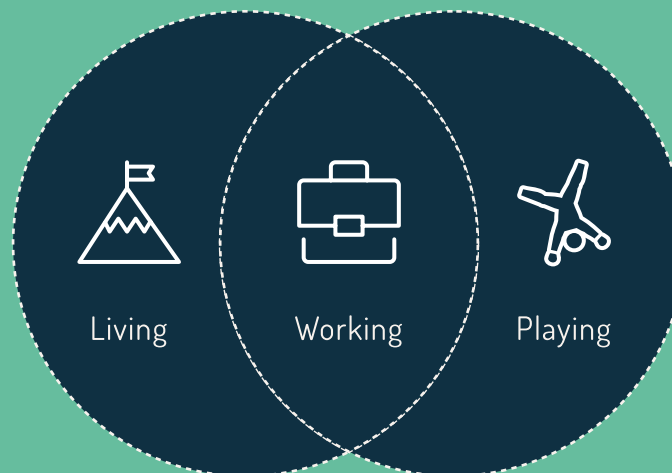

# Placements & Locations

Vietnam is an exciting country to live in, as it sees more and more advancements every year. It is an exemplary country in terms of development, with numerous successful social projects. ## locations:

They say variety is the spice of life, and we love sriracha and hoisin. That's why we have plenty of options for ESL teacher placements in Vietnam, spanning north to south, predominantly in or around Ho Chi Minh City and Hanoi and their surrounding suburbs and satellite towns.



## the internship:

You can expect to teach conversational English for ~35 hours weekly. That breaks down to 3-4 lessons daily, 5-6 days a week for ~20 hours of active teaching. That leaves you plenty of time to mastermind your next fave backup lesson!



## school placements:

Schools in Vietnam vary greatly. You may be placed in a private language school, a private primary or high school, or a government school. As well, the sizes of schools can fluctuate from a few students to thousands.



## perks

120 hours of TEFL training is included in this four and a half month paid internship. Your pay will be US\$1200-1800 monthly — plenty to cover costs with a little extra for something special.

Vietnamese culture is unlike any other, and discovering what makes it so distinct while teaching English here is hugely rewarding. Just beware — once you get a taste of life in Vietnam (and bánh mì), you might find it hard to leave.

## Orientation & Training

Beyond delightful icebreakers, orientation is your chance to get the real inside scoop on living and teaching in Vietnam from those who've done it already! Not only will we perfect our chopsticks skills over a fabulous welcome dinner, we'll have a crash course in Vietnamese (luckily for us, a lot of the letters look the same!), share our best advice for planning lessons effectively and efficiently, unpack the complexities of Vietnamese culture, and be sure to share the "gotta-know-it's" for life in Vietnam.

## FAQ

**I've already completed a TEFL course, can I get a discount?**

Yes! So long as you've completed comprehensive TEFL training, you'll be eligible for a further discount. [Contact us](#) to find out how much extra you'll save.

**How long before my start date should I arrive?**

You should book flights to arrive into Ho Chi Minh, Tan Son Nhat International Airport (SGN) on your specific internship arrival day, for airport pick up and orientation.

**How do I get from orientation to my placement?**

At the end of your orientation week, you'll travel by public transport (bus, train or air) to your placement location. Teachers pay for their own transport and some schools help with the cost.

**Will I be placed with other interns?**

In some cases there will be another intern at your school. In cases where one teacher is needed by a school you may choose to share housing with fellow interns. You'll get to know each other during orientation so it will be easy to plan meet-ups with new friends - you'll be joining a great community of teaching interns!

**How much will I get paid?**

Your US\$1200-1800 (€1065-€1,600/£900-£1350) monthly allowance will be paid in Vietnamese Dong either electronically to your Vietnam bank account or by cash. You should budget to have enough spending money to cover your first month to six weeks in Vietnam until you receive your monthly allowance.

**TIP:** Our previous interns say your first month can often be when you spend more - excursions, socialising and getting settled in. We recommend you try to budget a little extra per month for trips and then an emergency fund / credit card for unexpected events.

**Who will I be teaching?**

You'll be working in public primary, high schools or language schools.

**Can I be placed with a friend?**

You can request to be placed with a friend or as a couple. You'll have a spot on your application form to mention who you're traveling with.

**Note:** placement together is dependent on availability and can't be guaranteed.

**Where will I be located?**

There are both urban and more rural placements available throughout Vietnam including: Hanoi, Haiphong, Halong, Ho Chi Minh City, Vinh, Hue and in the Mekong Delta.

You will be asked to nominate your preference of placement (NB. due to availability preference can't be guaranteed, so it's best to be flexible and apply early).

### What will my housing be like?

On arrival at your placement location you'll have support from the in-country team to visit suitable housing options according to your budget preference. Studio apartments and shared housing typically cost US\$250-\$350 (€220-€300/£185-£260) monthly. For more plush accommodation, budget up to US\$450.

**Culture Tip:** Aside from the inexpensive cost, dining out plays a large role in Vietnamese socializing. Due to this, your housing might not have an extensive kitchen but you should be able to boil water and refrigerate food.

### I have dietary requirements, will I manage okay?

Yes, previous interns with both gluten and dairy free requirements as well as vegetarians have managed well with advice from our in-country team.

### What extras do I need to pay for?

- Doctor's letter (to say you're fit and well)
- Criminal record check
- Comprehensive travel insurance
- Visa and work permit
- Travel from orientation to placement
- Flights

### Can I book a one-way flight?

We advise booking a flexible ticket so you have the freedom to make travel plans while you're there. Officially those arriving to Vietnam are required to hold a departure ticket; however many travelers arrive on a one-way ticket as they plan to depart overland. Your visa will be valid for the 12 month duration of the program; you'll meet other interns that you'll want to travel with afterwards and be glad of a changeable travel ticket! Bordering Cambodia and Laos, an inexpensive bus ride will whisk you to the gateway of a new intriguing Asian culture within a few hours.

### Is there a chance I won't be accepted?

As with any internship your spot isn't guaranteed. Your application is subject to local school and visa approval. If your application is not approved by our partner schools you'll be refunded all of your internship fee plus 50% of the value of your included TEFL course. Essentially, you'll get TEFL trained at half price. We'll also guide you on other internship options or independent job searches.
